God Statement: God Has a Plan

KEY VERSE:

**“The Lord himself will go ahead of you. He will be with you.
He will never leave you. He’ll never desert you.”**

Deuteronomy 31:8, NIRV

CHECK-IN

Purpose: To build relationships with families and help parents feel comfortable leaving their child.

As parents check-in their child at your classroom, try to welcome them by name to help them feel secure in leaving their child in your care. Once you’ve completed each of the check-in procedures, welcome the child into your classroom and encourage him/her to play with the classroom toys and activities. If you have LITs in your classroom, this is a great time for them to help engage with the kids while you continue checking in the kids.

If a child is upset or reluctant to enter the room, encourage him or her by offering toys, books or other fun items. If a child is still upset, let the parents know that we will text them if their child continues to be upset. Then, offer to carry the child into the classroom and try to calm the child with toys or other activities.

CONNECT WITH KIDS

Purpose: To build relationships & prioritize safety for our youngest children.

Our goal, first and foremost, when serving babies and young toddlers is to prioritize building trusting relationships and the feeling of safety. We build trust with our littlest kids by meeting needs and helping them learn that church is a secure place where they are loved, known and safe.

The 4 S’s are a simple way to keep our hearts and minds focused on this:

When a child feels...(most of the time)

SAFE: physically and emotionally

SEEN: known and understood

SOOTHED: calmed and supported

They can become **SECURE.**

EXPLORE ACTIVITY

(10 minutes)

The Explore Activity is a chance to get the kids thinking about the upcoming Bible story for the day. Encourage your kids to engage with the activity as they prepare for the lesson.

DISCUSS:

In today's lesson, we are going to learn about how God is our Guide.

SAY: Do your parents tell you what to do? Yes, of course they do. They are your parents and want to keep you safe by giving you good safe rules. God gave His people rules too. We're going to practice following some funny rules. Are you ready?

PLAY: Follow the Rules!

(adapted from True Way Kids)

Supplies: None

Directions:

- Have kids line up and face you.
- Tell them that God gave rules to His people.
- Tell them to follow the rules that you will tell them.
- Do the action yourself and encourage the kids to do it with you.
- The rule is: spin around in a circle.
- The rule is: hop like a rabbit.
- The rule is: count to five.
- The rule is: sound like a cat.
- The rule is: sit down.
- The rule is: do crazy dance.
- The rule is: clap your hands.
- Continue to create more rules if time allows.
- You are very good at following rules!

WORSHIP TIME

Purpose: Engage our youngest children through the power of music!

Use the Little Kids music videos on Plex to sing some simple songs with your class. To access these videos, go to **Plex > Videos > EC > Babies folder**.

READ THE BIBLE STORY

Purpose: Engage our youngest children in a meaningful way by teaching God's word!

This week, read about a Bible story from Exodus 20.

Read the Bible story below. Try to engage the child(ren) as you share the story by showing pictures and repeating key words and phrases. It's ok if you don't read every word of the story! Kids have very short attention spans (1 minute for each year of age) so try to keep your interactions short and don't get discouraged if a child loses focus!

BIBLE STORY (5-7 minutes)

THIS WEEK'S LESSON: *The Ten Commandments*

(Summarized from Exodus 20 and taken from True Way Kids)

Bring Hamilton (the hedgehog puppet) out and allow the kids to interact with him before you begin the story (they can feel his soft fur, give him high fives, give him a hug, etc.). Use Hamilton to help keep the kids engaged while you share the story (he can read parts of the story, do the hand motions, ask the kids questions, etc.).

Invite Hamilton to come out and see the class. Hamilton is holding the story cards with Moses on the first one.

SAY: Hi Hamilton, what do you have there? ***Hamilton shows us.*** Oh, I see you have a picture. ***(Show the kids.)*** That is Moses. He was God's special helper. Let's hear more about Moses. ***Hamilton nods.***

Share the story of Moses and the Ten Commandments using the story cards in your folder.

SAY:

- Moses was a man who listened to God.
- One day, Moses climbed a mountain.
 - Let's pretend we are climbing a mountain.
- God spoke to Moses on the mountain.
 - Let's say: Hey Moses. "Hey Moses!" ***(Cup your hand up by your mouth as if you are calling someone.)***
- God gave Moses a special message for His people, called the Israelites.
- God wanted to care for His people and keep them safe, so He gave Moses rules for the people.
- God gave Moses stones with the rules written on them.
- The rules were called the Ten Commandments because there were ten rules altogether.
 - Let's count to 10! 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10!
- These rules would teach the people what was right.
 - Give me a thumbs up.
- The rules would also teach the people what was wrong.

- Give me a thumbs down.
- We follow God’s rules because He has a plan and His plan is good!
- God Has a Plan!

BLESSING (1 minute)

Read the verse and blessing over the kids before closing Large Group. Encourage the kids to stand and open their hands to receive the blessing as a truth that they can take with them this week and hide in their hearts.

SAY: Friends, may you always remember that God has a plan! His plan includes obeying Him. You can always ask Him to help you.

PLAY!

Purpose: Engage our youngest children by playing games and having fun!

While your class can participate in free play for most of the remaining classroom time, please try to lead at least one structured activity. This is a great opportunity to introduce kids to classroom games and encourage interaction and participation with others.

Suggestions of activities for Babies & Younger 1 Year Old’s:

- Play Peek-A-Boo
- Read a board book
- Build a tower and let kids knock it down
- Play with a ball
- Roll a large car back and forth
- Take turns putting toys in a bin or bucket

Suggestions of activities for Older 1 Year Old’s:

- Hide an object and let kids find it
- Name and count parts of the body
- Discuss colors & numbers
- Turn on music and play freeze dance
- Have kids follow simple instructions (hop, sit down, clap, etc.)

CHECK-OUT

(end of service)

As parents arrive for check-out, the kids can continue participating in free play. Follow the check-out procedures for your classroom, making sure to send all of the child’s belongings (diaper bag, bottle/sippy cup, pacifier, blanket, etc.) with the parent. Give the parent encouragement about how the child did in your class and say “Bye (child’s name)! ”
