

# God is in Control – The story of Job

Job 1-3

God Statement: God has a Plan

KEY VERSE: "The Lord Himself will go ahead of you. He will be with you. He will never leave you. He'll never desert you."

(Deuteronomy 31:8, NIRV)

## **CHECK-IN**

Classroom Teacher

(Until 15 minutes after the start of each service)

As kids check-in, please have them wash their hands or use hand sanitizer before entering your classroom. Then they can participate in the various activities and games in your classroom. 10 minutes after the start of your service time, ask the kids to clean up their activities and toys so you can begin the Explore Activity at 15 minutes after the start of service.

# **EXPLORE ACTIVITY**

Classroom Teacher (15 minutes)

The Explore Activity is a chance to get the kids thinking about the upcoming Bible story for the day. Encourage your kids to engage with the activity as they prepare for the lesson.

#### **DISCUSS: God is in Control**

In today's lesson, we are going to learn about how God forgives!

**SAY:** What does it mean to have control? *Let kids respond.* Controlling something means that you get to decide what is going to happen. Have you ever not had control of something? Or had a question about why things are happening? *Let a few kids respond.* It can be kind of hard to not have control all of the time right?

Do you know who is always in control? **Let kids respond – Jesus/God!** God! That's right! God is always in control. Even when we don't understand what is happening or why we

have to do something, God knows what will happen and He has a plan! Let's do a special activity before we learn more about this, today.

## **MAKE: Prayer Chain**

To get the kids thinking about the lesson, they can do this activity!

**Supplies:** 5-6 strips of paper per child, stapler or tape

**Directions:** Pass out 5-6 pieces of paper per child. Have them write prayers and items that they want to give to God on their strips of paper. Help them turn their papers into a paper chain.

SAY: Today we get to learn about how God is in control. We get to make a special prayer chain today. Can you think of something you can't control or something that you struggle with? Let's write it down and give it to God. As we write down our prayers we can add a paper to our prayer chain. When you go home, you can add more prayers each day and make the chain longer, and longer!

# **LARGE GROUP**

## (25 minutes)

Each week, Large Group will consist of an introduction, worship, the Bible lesson, worship response, and the blessing.

### **WELCOME & EXPECTATIONS**

#### Host

Depending on your age group, either find a designated space in your classroom or join the other classes for Large Group in the specified location.

As children enter into Large Group time, welcome and greet the children, telling them you're excited to have them joining this evening/morning.

#### **Expectations Slide**

Once everyone has found their seat, the host will use the Large Group expectations slide to go over the rules. Encourage various children to take turns reading the rules.

\*\*\* After Expectations, transition the power point to the "Worship" slide. \*\*\*

#### **KEY VERSE**

#### Host

Before you start worship, introduce/review the key Bible verse for the quarter. This is a great opportunity for you to talk about the importance of God's Word and encourage the kids to work on memorizing the verse each week.

\*\*\*Use the Key Verse Motions Video on Plex (or sent in weekly email) to learn the motions prior to Large Group. \*\*\*

\*\*\* After the Introduction, transition the power point to the Worship songs and invite the Worship Leader up front to lead the kids in worship.\*\*\*

#### **OPENING WORSHIP**

## **Worship Leader**

While the video is playing the opening worship songs, encourage the kids to sing and dance along. Don't forget to set the example by participating alongside them!

Kids may participate in the worship however they feel led. Encourage kids to find a way that helps them worship best but remind them that it's not time to goof off or talk to friends. If you have someone leading the worship up front, you can even invite a few kids to help.

#### **TODAY'S WORSHIP SONGS:**

- Help me Live in Step
- Egypt
- Closing: Grattitude

\*\*\* After Worship, transition the power point into the Bible Story video where the kids will hear about the lesson for the day.\*\*\*

#### **BIBLE STORY**

### Lesson Video

Remind the group before starting the video to follow the expectations for Large Group.

#### THIS WEEK'S LESSON: God is in Control – The story of Job

Encourage kids to listen and engage with the lesson as they watch the teaching video.

\*\*\*After the video finishes, turn on soft worship music (with or without lyrics) to transition into Worship Response. This should be background music to help set the tone for a quiet reflection time with God.\*\*\*

#### **WORSHIP RESPONSE**

#### Host

Worship Response is an opportunity for the kids to apply what they just learned and to respond to what God is doing in their life. *Have the kids sit in a place where they can be still and reflect independently.* Then read through the Worship Response prompts below as you lead the kids through the time.

#### DO: PRAISE & WORSHIP – God IS IN CONTROL

**Supplies:** worship song in PowerPoint - Gratitude

SAY: God is in control. Can you imagine for a moment that you had to go through all the hard things Job did? All that pain and loss and sadness? When Job lost everything he had, did he yell at God and blame God and run away from God? *Let kids respond – No!* No, Job didn't. Does anyone remember what Job did when he lost everything? *Let kids respond.* That's right, Job fell to the ground and worshipped God.

Hmm... Why would Job worship and praise God if all that bad stuff had just happened? Because Job knew that God is in control and Job knew that God had a plan for his life, even if it was hard at times.

Think for a moment about your own life. Have you ever had something really hard or sad happen to you? Maybe to someone in your family? Think about how it made you feel.

Now think about how BIG our God is and how much God loves you. He loves you so much He sent His Son, Jesus, to die on the cross for you! God is so good! We're going to take some time to practice worshipping God no matter what we're going through because God is in control and He deserves our worship!

DIRECTIONS: Turn on worship song and allow kids to respond in worship how they want.

SAY: I'm so glad that God is in control! Let's thank God for who He is!

Close time in prayer.

\*\*\*After Worship Response, transition the power point to the closing Worship videos and invite the Worship Leader to come back up.\*\*\*

#### **CLOSING WORSHIP**

## **Worship Leader**

Play the closing worship song included in the power point and encourage the kids to sing and praise along.

This closing song is intended to be a transition for the kids to finish processing and reflecting on the lesson before transitioning to the small group time.

\*\*\*After Worship Response, transition the power point to the Offering slides.\*\*\*

#### **OFFERING**

#### Host

Before closing large group, take a moment to explain that every week, we provide an opportunity for our Woodmen Kids to participate in tithing. We believe God is our provider, and it is our privilege to give back to God what He has so graciously given us. Then, remind kids that if anyone brought an offering, now is the time to come forward to donate.

Ask a child to come up and pray for the offering.

\*\*\*After Offering, transition the power point to the "Announcement" slide. The host will discuss any current announcements.\*\*\*

# ANNOUNCEMENTS & SPECIAL MISSIONS FOCUS – ACTs Senior Center

#### Host

Take this opportunity to cover any announcements and special missions focus for the kids, such as upcoming events or reminders, like bringing food donations for Feeding Families. Use the slides provided in the PowerPoint to display important announcements.

#### **ACTs Senior Center**

**SAY:** Raise your hand if you have something to be thankful for? **Pause let the kids respond.** That's right, every person has something to be thankful for! At the beginning of class each of you made a special turkey wreath with feathers stating something you are thankful for. Not only are the wreaths meant to teach you the importance of having a heart of gratitude, but they are also a big way that we show the seniors of the ACTs Senior Center Ministry that we are thinking of them and care about them.

SAY: As we enter into the holiday season, our new mission focus for the next two weeks is ACTS Senior Center Ministry. The holidays are a great time to remember others and to love others well through what we say and do! During the next two weeks, think of how you can show love to the seniors in your life! Maybe you can spend a special day with your grandparents and tell them how much they mean to you. Maybe you can hold the door open for a senior at the store or at church. Or maybe you can say 'hi' to a senior in your neighborhood and ask them about their day. Let's love well!

Invite a couple kids to come up and pray for the seniors who will receive the wreaths, that they would feel known, loved, and seen by Jesus.

\*\*\*After Announcements, transition the power point to the "Blessing" slide. The host will lead the class in receiving the blessing for the day. \*\*\*

## **BLESSING**

#### Host

Read the verse and blessing over the kids before closing Large Group. Encourage the kids to stand and open their hands to receive the blessing as a truth that they can take with them this week and hide in their hearts.

May you follow God as your leader this week, trusting that He has a plan for you because He loves you!

# **SMALL GROUP**

# Classroom Teachers (10 minutes)

#### **Younger Kids:**

This time is optional for younger kids, depending on if you feel like the kids are still listening and participating well.

- 1. What did you learn about God from our story today? (God is in Control.)
- 2. Read/ Recap today's story: Job 1:9-22
  - What happened to Job's farm animals? (They were stolen.)
  - What happened to Job's kids? (They died; the house collapsed on them.)
  - So many bad and sad things happened to Job, what did he do (v. 20-22)? (He fell to the ground and worshipped God.)
- 3. Job was a man who loved God with all His heart. He listened and obeyed God. Satan thought he was faithful to God because God always rewarded him. Until one day so many sad things happened to Job. He got sick, his animals were taken, his kids passed away. So many sad things happened to him. But instead of being mad at God and running away from him, Job turned his sadness into gratitude. He had hope in God and the plan God has for his life. He praised him because no matter what happens, God is good. Throughout this week I want to challenge you guys to praise God no matter what. If something doesn't go your way or you get bad news I want to challenge you to stop and pray thanking God that he is good.
  - Take a few minutes talking together as a group on how we can praise God even in the storm. What does this look like? How do we do this?

**Close small group in prayer.** Take a few minutes to share prayer requests as a group. This is a great time to write requests down on the prayer tags for leaders to take home!

#### **Older Kids:**

Encourage the kids to utilize their personal Bibles or the classroom Bibles to read the Scripture as a group.

- 1. What did you learn about God from our story today? (God is in Control.)
- 2. Read/ Recap today's story: Job 1:9-22
  - What happened to Job's farm animals? (They were stolen.)
  - What happened to Job's kids? (They died; the house collapsed on them.)
  - So many bad and sad things happened to Job, what did he do (v. 20-22)? (He fell to the ground and worshipped God.)
- 3. As a group re-read Job 1:20-22. Job praised God in the middle of the storm. What does this mean? Do you ever feel like so much happens to you? Do you feel like the storm can be a lot at times? What does it feel like when your in the middle of a "storm". Do you ever feel like praising God for the difficult times we go through? Take a couple of minutes sharing as a group. this is a good time to be vulnerable..
- 4. Job was a man who loved God with all His heart. He listened and obeyed God. Satan thought he was faithful to God because God always rewarded him. Until one day so many sad things happened to Job. He got sick, his animals were taken, his kids passed away. So many sad things happened to him. But instead of being mad at God and running away from him, Job turned his sadness into gratitude. He had hope in God and the plan God has for his life. He praised him because no matter what happens, God is good. Throughout this week I want to challenge you guys to praise God no matter what. If something doesn't go your way or you get bad news I want to challenge you to stop and pray thanking God that he is good.
  - Take a few minutes talking together as a group on how we can praise God even in the storm. What does this look like? How do we do this?

**Close small group in prayer.** Take a few minutes to share prayer requests as a group. This is a great time to write requests down on the prayer tags for leaders to take home!

# Classroom Teacher (10 minutes)

#### **DISCUSS:**

If you have extra time at the end of your lesson and small group time, the kids can participate in this activity.

**PLAY: Worry Toss Game** 

Supplies: colorful pieces of paper

**Directions:** Pass out one piece of paper per child. Have them write down or draw their worries on their piece of paper. Then when they are done. Have them pray for god to take these worries away. Have the children rip up their pieces, crumple up, throw away, their paper etc. They can be creative on how they "toss away" their worries!

SAY: Today we got to learn about how God is in Control! He is always with us and we can tell Him all of our worries. Let's play a game to remind us that we can give our worries to God. We will get to write down our worries and then rip them up and toss them away after we pray for them!
