GOD IS OUR

LEADER

LESSON GOAL:

Background: God used Joshua to lead the Israelites to the promise land. Before they could reach the promise land, they had to cross the Jordan River. After three days and three nights of waiting, God told Joshua to lead his people across the rushing waves of water. As the Israelites stepped into the water, the water stopped flowing, allowing them to cross on dry land. The Israelites created a memorial with 12 big rocks from the river, reminding generations to come that God led His people across the Jordan River on dry ground.

Lesson Goal: For kids to understand that God is our leader and we can trust in His plans to guide us through any trials we may face.

MISSION FOCUS:

CHECK-IN

The goal of check-in is to greet parents/guardians and children by name and help them feel known and welcome.



I'm so glad to see you today, (insert child/parent name)!

Grab today's **Lesson Card**. Look up the Bible passage in your own Bible or a classroom Bible and leave your card there as a bookmark. Then, you can play with the classroom activities until we begin Explore time.

EXPLORE

The goal of Explore is to help kids connect relationally and think about the Bible story. It should be completed in small groups of 5-7 kids per one Ministry Partner.



DISCUSS: God is Our Leader!

Help kids connect relationally by asking them about their week, then discuss the lesson topic for the day and read the Bible passage together.



Let's take turns sharing three words about our week. I'll go first! Share your three words then invite the next child to share.



Today, we are learning about how **God is Our Leader.** This story comes from the Bible in Joshua 4:20-24. Can you open your Bible to the passage with me so we can read it together?



Read the Bible passage aloud or pick a child to read it aloud.



CONNECT: Why Does It Matter?

Help kids prepare for the lesson by thinking through the Big 3 questions and how the lesson relates to them, personally.



Let's answer THE BIG 3 questions for today's lesson & talk about how it applies to our lives!

1. Who was our story about today? God, Joshua, & the Israelites

2. What was the problem?

God's people were trying to get to the Promised Land, but they couldn't cross the Jordan River on their own

3. What did God do?

God led his people across the river on dry ground. God's people made a memorial of stones to remember God leads His people!

Encourage kids to think about why this matters and how they can apply it to their own life as they listen to the story!



MAKE: Crossing the Jordan Activity Page

Help kids think about the lesson further and have fun by doing this activity!

Supplies: River activity page and people cut out, scissors, glue, markers/crayons



DO:

Pass out one activity page and person template per child. Have them cut out their person template (if not already done so) and glue it to the designated space on the river page. Allow kids to color their pages.



God is our leader! In our story, we are going to learn about how God was with Joshua and asked him to lead the Israelites across the Jordan River on dry ground. God made a way for them! Let's make a craft to remind us of our lesson.



CLEAN UP: Transition to Large Group

Ask kids to clean up the activity or save it to finish for the end of class. Then, ask kids to line up and/or transition to Large Group.

LARGE GROUP

The goal of Large Group is to help kids grow in their relationship with God by participating in Worship and hearing an engaging Bible story.



EXPECTATIONS

As kids transition to Large Group time, play the expectations video.



HOST MOMENT

After the Large Group expectations video is finished, the Host should welcome the kids in an engaging way and share the daily host content.



Welcome! We're so glad you're here today! Let's take a few minutes to look at our Missions project for the day and our Key Verse.

MISSION FOCUS

Introduce or share an update about the current mission focus.

KEY VERSE

Introduce the key verse then have the kids watch the Key Verse video.

PRAY FOR WORSHIP & BIBLE LESSON



WORSHIP

Invite your Worship Leader to come up and play the worship song videos. Encourage kids to participate and be respectful to others.

SONG 1: Rescuer

SONG 2: Egypt



LESSON VIDEO

Play the daily Bible lesson video.



WORSHIP RESPONSE

Lead the kids through a quiet time of responding to what God is teaching them.



BLESSING

As Large Group ends, speak this blessing over the kids.

May you walk boldly and confidently as you follow God! He is your leader!



After the blessing, the Host should dismiss the kids to return quietly to their classroom (if applicable) and transition to Respond.

WORSHIP RESPONSE



REFLECT: God is Our Leader!

Help kids reflect on the lesson by providing a quiet space for the Holy Spirit to work in their hearts as they think about how it applies to them personally.

Worship Response Station

Supplies: stone cards (1 per kid), writing utensils, tape, open space on the wall



God is our leader! God used Joshua to lead the Israelites, God's chosen people, to the promise land. God even led the Israelites right through the Jordan River on dry ground because God can do anything and God was their leader! The Israelites stacked 12 big rocks to help them remember what God had done! God is our leader too. We can trust in God's plans to guide us through any trials or obstacles we may face in life.



DO:

- Ask the kids to quietly participate in the following activity. Say:
 - God is our leader! We can follow God because He is good and He loves us!
 - Pass out the stone cards and writing utensils to each kid.
 - Think about a time in your life when God has led you through something hard or scary. Write or draw that time on the stone.
 - Let kids have a few minutes to do this. Then, invite kids to come up and tape the stones on the wall stacking upon each other.
 - God is our leader. Just like the Israelites stacked stones to remember what God had done for them, we can remember too. God is faithful and we can trust that God will lead us through anything!
 - God is our leader and He loves us!
- Close the time by praying over the kids.



As Large Group ends, speak this blessing over the kids.

RESPOND

The goal of Respond is for kids to think about the lesson and how it applies to them. It should be completed in small groups of 5-7 kids per one Ministry Partner.



APPLY: Why Does it Matter?

Help kids process what they learned in the lesson by answering the Big 3 questions you asked at the beginning of class.



Let's answer THE BIG 3 questions for today's lesson & talk about how it applies to our lives!

1. Who was our story about today?

God, Joshua, & the Israelites

2. What was the problem?

God's people were trying to get to the Promised Land, but they couldn't cross the Jordan River on their own

3. What did God do?

God led His people across the river on dry ground. God's people made a memorial of stones to remember God leads His people!

4. Why does this matter to me?

God is my leader too. I can trust that God's plans are good and He will guide me through good and hard times.

5. How can I apply this to my own life?

Example: I can think about ways God has led me before and write them down to remember; I can tell others about God as my leader; I can practice following God by reading the Bible and talking to Him



PRAY: Connect Relationally

Help kids understand the power of praying together. Use the Prayer Tags from Check-In to write down prayer requests to take home and pray for during the week.



Does anyone have a prayer request they'd like to share? You can also share with a leader privately, if you don't want to share aloud.



DO:

Invite kids to pray for each other, then the leader closes in prayer.



CHECK-OUT

The goal of check-out is to re-connect kids with their parent and communicate any upcoming events or announcements as families leave.



DO:

Encourage kids to finish their activities or play classroom games until their parent comes to pick them up.

As kids get picked up, mention any announcements while handing them the announcement card and ensuring they take their weekly Lesson Card.
