Faithful means God will always do what He says He will do.



Background: Even though Abraham and Sarah struggled to believe God's promise to give them a baby, God remained faithful to His Word. As they were both very old, Sarah and Abraham finally had a son of their own, and named him Isaac. God was faithful to fulfill His promise!

Lesson Goal: For kids to understand that even when we can't see it. God is working in powerful ways to fulfill His promises. Just like Abraham and Sarah, we may have doubts and try to do things our own way, but we can trust that God is faithful, even when we are not!

CHECK-IN

The goal of check-in is to greet parents/guardians and children by name and help them feel known and welcome.



I'm so glad to see you today, (insert child/parent name)! You can play with the classroom activities until we begin Explore time.

EXPLORE

The goal of Explore is to help kids connect relationally and think about the Bible story. It should be completed in small groups of 5-7 kids per one Ministry Partner.



DISCUSS: God is Faithful!

Help kids connect relationally and to the daily lesson by participating in the Bag of Wonder activity together.

Bag of Wonder: baby



We are going to take turns passing around this Bag of Wonder! It has something inside that helps us think about our lesson today. You can hold it, smell it, shake it, touch it...but no peeking inside! What do you think it could be? You each get one guess!



Pass the Bag of Wonder around until each child has had a turn holding it and guessing what's in the bag. Offer hints to help the kids guess the item.



I wonder why this item is in our Bag of Wonder today! Our lesson is about how God is Faithful. This true story comes from the Bible in Genesis 21! (Open your Bible to show the kids the verse is in the Bible then read the explanation below).

CONNECTION: In today's story, we're going to keep learning about Abraham and Sarah! Even though Abraham and Sarah struggled to believe God's promise to give them a baby, God remained faithful to His Word. As they were both very old, Sarah and Abraham finally had a son of their own, and named him Isaac. God was faithful to fulfill His promise!



CONNECT: Why Does It Matter?

Help kids prepare for the lesson by thinking through the Big 3 questions and how the lesson relates to them, personally.



Let's answer THE BIG 3 questions for today's lesson & talk about how it applies to our lives!

1. Who is our story about today?

God, Abraham, & Sarah

2. What is the problem?

God made a promise to give Abraham and Sarah lots of descendants, but they were very old and struggling to trust God's promise

3. What will God do?

God remained faithful to Abraham and Sarah and gave them a son named Isaac

Encourage kids to think about why this matters and how they can apply it to their own life as they listen to the story!



MAKE: Abraham and Sarah Tent Craft

Help kids think about the lesson further and have fun by doing this activity!

Supplies: Abraham and Sarah page, colorful tent doors, glue, crayons/markers, God Statement Sticker



DO:

Pass out one page per child. Allow them to pick a colorful door to attach to the tent. Help them glue the door on the side to open and close. Have kids decorate their pages and add the God Statement Sticker to their paper.



God is faithful! God provided for Sarah and Abraham! We get to learn about this in our story today, but first let's make a special craft!





CLEAN UP: Transition to Large Group

Ask kids to clean up the activity or save it to finish for the end of class. Then, ask kids to line up and/or transition to Large Group.

LARGE GROUP

The goal of Large Group is to help kids grow in their relationship with God by participating in Worship and hearing an engaging Bible story.



EXPECTATIONS

As kids transition to Large Group time, play the expectations video.



HOST MOMENT

After the Large Group expectations video is finished, the Host should welcome the kids in an engaging way and share the daily host content.



Welcome! We're so glad you're here today! Let's take a few minutes to look at our Missions project for the day and our Key Verse.

MISSION FOCUS

Introduce or share an update about the current mission focus.

KEY VERSE

Introduce the key verse then have the kids watch the Key Verse video.

PRAY FOR WORSHIP & BIBLE LESSON



WORSHIP

Invite your Worship Leader to come up and play the worship song videos. Encourage kids to participate and be respectful to others.

SONG 1: Way Maker

SONG 2: When I Look Up



LESSON VIDEO

Play the daily Bible lesson video.



WORSHIP RESPONSE

Lead the kids through a quiet time of responding to what God is teaching them.



BLESSING

As Large Group ends, speak this blessing over the kids.

May you remember that God will always do what He says He will do because God is faithful! We can trust in Him!



TRANSITION

After the blessing, the Host should dismiss the kids to return quietly to their classroom (if applicable) and transition to Respond.

WORSHIP RESPONSE



REFLECT: God is Faithful!

Help kids reflect on the lesson by providing a quiet space for the Holy Spirit to work in their hearts as they think about how it applies to them personally.

Worship Response Station

Supplies: blank cards, writing utensils

Just like Abraham and Sarah, we may have doubts and try to do things our own way, but we can trust that God is faithful, even when we are not!



DO:

- Ask the kids to quietly participate in the following activity. Say:
 - Abraham and Sarah had doubts about how God would keep His promise. A doubt is when you feel uncertain or unsure about something.
 - Have you ever had doubts about what God said He will do? Think in your head about that question.
 - God is always faithful! But we are human, which means we are not perfect and holy like God.
 - We all have doubts and fears, but the good news is God's love for us doesn't change even when we doubt!
 - · Why? Because while we were still sinners, God sent His Son, Jesus, to die on the cross for OUR sins to save us! All because God loves you!
 - God isn't afraid of our fears and doubts God is bigger than them!
 - Let's take time now and bring our doubts to God!
 - Pass out a card/marker to each kid. Invite them to write/draw a doubt they have and when they are ready, lay it at the foot of the cross and say "God is faithful!"
- Close the time by praying over the kids.



As Large Group ends, speak this blessing over the kids.

RESPOND

The goal of Respond is for kids to think about the lesson and how it applies to them. It should be completed in small groups of 5-7 kids per one Ministry Partner.



APPLY: Why Does it Matter?

Help kids process what they learned in the lesson by answering the Big 3 questions you asked at the beginning of class.



Let's answer THE BIG 3 questions for today's lesson & talk about how it applies to our lives!

- 1. Who was our story about today?
 - God. Abraham. & Sarah
- 2. What was the problem?

God made a promise to give Abraham and Sarah lots of descendants, but they were very old and struggling to trust God's promise

3. What did God do?

God remained faithful to Abraham and Sarah and gave them a son named Isaac 4. Why does this matter to me?

Even when I doubt God and try to do things my own way, God is still faithful to do what He says He will do

5. How can I apply this to my own life?

Example: I can tell God all my doubts and fears and ask Him for help to trust Him: I can read stories in the Bible about God's faithfulness



PRAY: Connect Relationally

Help kids understand the power of praying together. Use the Prayer Tags from Check-In to write down prayer requests to take home and pray for during the week.



Does anyone have a prayer request they'd like to share? You can also share with a leader privately, if you don't want to share aloud.



DO:

Invite kids to pray for each other, then the leader closes in prayer.



CHECK-OUT

The goal of check-out is to re-connect kids with their parent and communicate any upcoming events or announcements as families leave.



DO:

Encourage kids to finish their activities or play classroom games until their parent comes to pick them up.

As kids get picked up, mention any announcements while handing their parent the announcement card and the weekly **Lesson Card**.
