LESSON GOAL:

BIBLE STORY:

Isaac is Born

MAKE: God is Faithful Handprint Stars

Help each baby create a fun and meaningful reminder that God always keeps His promises.



DIRECTIONS:

Gently press each baby's hand onto a yellow ink pad, then help them press their handprint onto the center of the star.

BLESSING:

Say, "Look at your bright yellow handprint, it's a shining star! God told Abraham to look at the stars and remember His promise. Just like Abraham, we can always trust that God is Faithful!"

PLAY: Star Sticker Sky

SUPPLIES: cardstock and removable felt stars

DIRECTIONS:

Find a soft, clean space to sit with baby either in your lap or on a tummy time mat. Gently guide baby's hand to touch and press the soft felt stars onto the blue sky (cardstock). Let them explore the texture with your help as they "place" the stars.

SAY:

"You're helping place stars in the sky just like when God told Abraham to look at the stars and promised him a baby! That baby was Isaac. God kept His promise because God is always faithful. You are part of God's big promise too!"

PLAY: Peekaboo "Where's the Promise?"

SUPPLIES: baby blanket, baby doll or plush

DIRECTIONS:

Hide the baby under the blanket and gently play peekaboo.

SAY:

"Where's the baby? Peekaboo! Just like God gave Abraham a surprise when Isaac was born, God always comes through! God is faithful"
