READ OVER THE BABIES

Read these over the babies as you interact with them.

PRAYER

BIBLE STORY

Read from the Big Picture Bible-
God's People Grow pg. 83

BIBLE VERSE

"So God gave his word when he made his promise. He wanted to make it very clear that his purpose does not change. He wanted those who would receive what was promised to know this."
Hebrews 6:17 NIRV

BLESSING

Remember that God has a plan for your life and that He created you in His image. He always keeps His promises, so hold onto faith and trust in the path He has set for you.

EXPLORE ACTIVITIES

Use these activities to relate to this month's God statement and play with the children

Peak-a-Boo

Use light weight scarfs to play peak-a-boo with the child or toys in the classroom.

SAY: "Peak-a-boo I see you. God created you in His image."

Rainbow Ball

Stuff scarfs in Oball and demonstrate to child how to pull the scarf out.

SAY: "God made our hands to feel and touch. Use your hand to pull out the scarves."

Parachute

Have children stand in a circle holding on to the handle of a parachute. Practice making arches like a rainbow. They can go fast or slow. You can place soft balls in the middle to bounce.

SAY: "Look at the colors on the parachute. It reminds me of a rainbow. The rainbow is a sign that God kept his promise to Noah. God is Promise Keeper!"

Rainbow Matching

Have children match the colored pom balls with the correct strip of paper in the plastic bag.

SAY: "Look at the colors. There is red, orange, yellow, green, blue, and purple. The poms look like buttons on a coat. Remember Joseph and the coat of many colors? God took care of Joseph because God keeps His promises."

KEEPSAKE

Help each baby create a memorable craft for a loved one.

MAKE: Rainbow Footprint

Supplies: rainbow stamp pad, papers, wipes

Prepare all of your supplies, including wipes for cleaning up. Press child's bare foot on the rainbow stamp pad. Press child's foot around the arch to create a rainbow.

SAY: "Look at your footprint. See the many colors. We see these colors in the sky after a big rain. God used the rainbow in the sky to remind Noah that God keeps His promises. God is promise keeper!"
