JESUS IS KING



LESSON GOAL:

Background: Palm Sunday is the day we celebrate when Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey while people waved palm branches and shouted "Hosanna!" a week before He was crucified. Jesus did this to share His claim to be their Messiah and King of Israel in fulfillment of the Old Testament prophecy.

Lesson Goal: For kids to celebrate the triumphal entry of our King, Jesus, while understanding the way He came to earth to die on the cross for our sins.

MISSION FOCUS:

TEACHER APPRECIATION

Our teachers do so much for us—they help us learn, encourage us, and show us kindness. So, for the whole month of April, we want to show *them* how much we appreciate all they do for us.

Here's how you can be a part of it: First, think of a teacher in your life—maybe at school, here at church, or even your coach. Then, choose **one kind act** to show them appreciation—maybe a kind note, a picture or just saying 'Thank you for all you do!'

Most importantly, we're going to pray for our teachers, asking God to encourage them and give them wisdom, strength, and joy!

CHECK-IN

The goal of check-in is to greet parents/guardians and children by name and help them feel known and welcome.



I'm so glad to see you today, (insert child/parent name)!

Grab today's **Lesson Card**. Look up the Bible passage in your own Bible or a classroom Bible and leave your card there as a bookmark. Then, you can play with the classroom activities until we begin Explore time.



EXPLORE

The goal of Explore is to help kids connect relationally and think about the Bible story. It should be completed in small groups of 5-7 kids per one Ministry Partner.



DISCUSS: Jesus is King!

Help kids connect relationally by asking them about their week, then discuss the lesson topic for the day and read the Bible passage together.



Let's take turns sharing 3 words about our week. I'll go first! Share your 3 words then invite the next child to share.



Today, we are learning about how **Jesus is King.** This story comes from the Bible in **Matthew 11:1-11.** Can you open your Bible to the passage with me so we can read it together?



Read the Bible passage aloud or pick a child to read it aloud.

CONNECT: Why Does It Matter?

Help kids prepare for the lesson by thinking through the Big 3 questions and how the lesson relates to them, personally.



Let's answer THE BIG 3 questions for today's lesson & talk about how it applies to our lives!

1. Who is our story about today?

2. What is the problem?

People didn't know that Jesus was the King yet

3. What will God do?

Jesus entered Jerusalem on a donkey exactly how Jesus said he would many many years before to show that He was the promised Savior





MAKE: Palm Branch Craft

Help kids think about the lesson further and have fun by doing this activity!

Supplies: brown popsicle stick, palm branch (small), God statement sticker, glue, markers/crayons



DO:

Pass out one palm branch per child. Allow them to decorate it using the markers and crayons. Have kids glue a popsicle stick to the back of their palm branch and place the God Statement sticker on the front.



Jesus is King! Did you know when Jesus entered Jerusalem the people waved palm branches as He rode in on a donkey? Today we get to make our own palm branches. As we wave them, we can remember that Jesus is the true King and He came to earth to die for our sins.



CLEAN UP: Transition to Large Group

Ask kids to clean up the activity or save it to finish for the end of class. Then, ask kids to line up and/or transition to Large Group.

LARGE GROUP

The goal of Large Group is to help kids grow in their relationship with God by participating in Worship and hearing an engaging Bible story.



EXPECTATIONS

As kids transition to Large Group time, play the expectations video.



HOST MOMENT

After the Large Group expectations video is finished, the Host should welcome the kids in an engaging way and share the daily host content.



Welcome! We're so glad you're here today! Let's take a few minutes to look at our Missions project for the day and our Key Verse.

MISSION FOCUS

Introduce or share an update about the current mission focus.

KEY VERSE

Introduce the key verse then have the kids watch the Key Verse video.

PRAY FOR WORSHIP & BIBLE LESSON



WORSHIP

Invite your Worship Leader to come up and play the worship song videos. Encourage kids to participate and be respectful to others.

SONG 1: There is a Savior

SONG 2: Build My Life



LESSON VIDEO

Play the daily Bible lesson video.



WORSHIP RESPONSE

Lead the kids through a quiet time of responding to what God is teaching them.



BLESSING

As Large Group ends, speak this blessing over the kids.

May you know Jesus, your King, has come to save you from your sins! May you feel His love today!



TRANSITION

After the blessing, the Host should dismiss the kids to return quietly to their classroom (if applicable) and transition to Respond.

WORSHIP RESPONSE



REFLECT: Jesus is King!

Help kids reflect on the lesson by providing a quiet space for the Holy Spirit to work in their hearts as they think about how it applies to them personally.

Worship Response Station

Supplies: "There is a Savior" worship song in PowerPoint



Just as God said it would happen many years before, Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey one Sunday. As He did, the people waved palm branches and shouted "Hosanna!" Jesus made it known that He is Messiah and King of Israel as He entered in this way. We celebrate Palm Sunday today because this triumphal entry was all part of God's plan to send Jesus to the cross to die for our sins. Jesus is King!



DO:

- Ask the kids to quietly participate in the following activity. Say:
 - What did the people shout as Jesus entered Jerusalem? (Let kids respond.)
 - Hosanna! That word "Hosanna" means "Please save us!"
 - Why would all those people be shouting "Please save us!" to Jesus? Because they knew He is the King! Jesus is the King who God sent to save us from our sins.
 - Let's take some time right now to praise and worship Jesus.
 - As we sing this song, think about the truth that Jesus is YOUR King. We know what Jesus did on the cross, He died and rose again saving us from our sins!
 - Let's praise God together for sending Jesus to be our King.
 - Use the song in the PowerPoint and invite kids to stand and respond in worship.
- Close the time by praying over the kids.



BLESSING

As Large Group ends, speak this blessing over the kids.



May you know Jesus, your King, has come to save you from your sins! May you feel His love today!

RESPOND

The goal of Respond is for kids to think about the lesson and how it applies to them. It should be completed in small groups of 5-7 kids per one Ministry Partner.



APPLY: Why Does it Matter?

Help kids process what they learned in the lesson by answering the Big 3 questions you asked at the beginning of class.



Let's answer THE BIG 3 questions for today's lesson & talk about how it applies to our lives!

- 1. Who was our story about today? Jesus
- 2. What was the problem?

3. What did God do?

Jesus entered Jerusalem on a donkey exactly how Jesus said he would many many years before to show that He was the promised Savior

- 4. Why does this matter to me?
 - Jesus did this to show that He is the king and Messiah - He came to save me from my sins!
- 5. How can I apply this to my own life?

Example: I can trust that Jesus came to save me; I can praise God anywhere and anytime for sending Jesus to save me



PRAY: Connect Relationally

Help kids understand the power of praying together. Use the Prayer Tags from Check-In to write down prayer requests to take home and pray for during the week.



Does anyone have a prayer request they'd like to share? You can also share with a leader privately, if you don't want to share aloud.



DO:

Invite kids to pray for each other, then the leader closes in prayer.



CHECK-OUT

The goal of check-out is to re-connect kids with their parent and communicate any upcoming events or announcements as families leave.



DO:

Encourage kids to finish their activities or play classroom games until their parent comes to pick them up.

As kids get picked up, mention any announcements while handing them the announcement card and ensuring they take their weekly **Lesson Card**.
