JESUS CHOOSES HIS FIRST DISCIPLES

March 22 & 23
**GOD IS
OUR LEADER**



LESSON GOAL:

Background: Jesus chose twelve followers called disciples who learned from Him and were trained by Him. Each of the twelve men God chose as his disciples were just ordinary people. But God used each of them in extraordinary ways. Jesus called his first disciples to be fishers of men - He wanted them to help others have faith in Jesus.

Lesson Goal: For kids to understand that Jesus wants each of us to be disciples and follow Him. God can use ordinary people like us to share the good news of Jesus when we follow Him!

KEY VERSE:

MISSION FOCUS:

CURE INTERNATIONAL

CURE is a group that loves Jesus and helps kids feel better. They have hospitals in Africa and the Philippines where doctors fix things like little feet that need straightening and legs that need help to walk right. Kids from many countries come to CURE to get better!

During the month of May, you can help by bringing a gift of money to help a child get the care they need or praying for those who are part of CURE.

CHECK-IN

The goal of check-in is to greet parents/guardians and children by name and help them feel known and welcome.



SAY:

I'm so glad to see you today, **(insert child/parent name)**! Do you have any offering to put in our offering bin? *(Direct child to offering station)*

You can play with the classroom activities until we begin Explore time.

EXPLORE

The goal of Explore is to help kids connect relationally and think about the Bible story. It should be completed in small groups of 5-7 kids per one Ministry Partner.



DISCUSS: God is Our Leader!

Help kids connect relationally and to the daily lesson by participating in the Bag of Wonder activity together.

Bag of Wonder: footprints



SAY:

We are going to take turns passing around this Bag of Wonder! It has something inside that helps us think about our lesson today. You can hold it, smell it, shake it, touch it...but no peeking inside! What do you think it could be? You each get 1 guess!



DO:

Pass the Bag of Wonder around until each child has had a turn holding it and guessing what's in the bag. Offer hints to help the kids guess the item.



SAY:

I *wonder* why this item is in our Bag of Wonder today! Our lesson is about how **God is Our Leader**. This true story comes from the Bible in **Matthew 4:18-22!** *(Open your Bible to show the kids the verse is in the Bible then read the explanation below).*

CONNECTION: Today, we get to learn about how Jesus called His disciples to follow Him. Just like Jesus called ordinary men to do extraordinary things, He calls each of us to do great things too. We can trust God and confidently follow wherever He guides us because God is our leader!



CONNECT: Why Does It Matter?

Help kids prepare for the lesson by thinking through the Big 3 questions and how the lesson relates to them, personally.



SAY:

Let's answer THE BIG 3 questions for today's lesson & talk about how it applies to our lives!

1. Who is our story about today?

Jesus and his 12 disciples

2. What is the problem?

Jesus called 12 ordinary guys to be his followers, but many didn't think they were good enough to be a disciple

3. What will God do?

Jesus showed the disciples that He is our leader and God can use anyone to do extraordinary things when we have faith in Him

Encourage kids to think about why this matters and how they can apply it to their own life as they listen to the story!



MAKE: Follow Jesus-Feet Craft

Help kids think about the lesson further and have fun by doing this activity!

Supplies: paper feet (1 pair per child), markers/crayons, God statement sticker



DO:

Pass out one pair of paper feet per child.
Allow them to color their feet and then add the God statement sticker to one of the feet.
Children can wear their feet when they get picked up at the end of class.



SAY:

God wants us to be disciples and to follow Him! I am excited to follow Jesus and to share Him with others. Let's make a special craft to prepare us for our lesson today.



CLEAN UP: Transition to Large Group

Ask kids to clean up the activity or save it to finish for the end of class. Then, ask kids to line up and/or transition to Large Group.

LARGE GROUP

The goal of Large Group is to help kids grow in their relationship with God by participating in Worship and hearing an engaging Bible story.



EXPECTATIONS

As kids transition to Large Group time, play the expectations video.



HOST MOMENT

After the Large Group expectations video is finished, the Host should welcome the kids in an engaging way and share the daily host content.



SAY:

Welcome! We're so glad you're here today! Let's take a few minutes to look at our Missions project for the day and our Key Verse.

MISSION FOCUS

Introduce or share an update about the current mission focus.

KEY VERSE

Introduce the key verse then have the kids watch the Key Verse video.

PRAY FOR WORSHIP & BIBLE LESSON



WORSHIP

Invite your Worship Leader to come up and play the worship song videos. Encourage kids to participate and be respectful to others.

SONG 1: Open the Eyes of My Heart

SONG 2: Help Me Live in Step



LESSON VIDEO

Play the daily Bible lesson video.



WORSHIP RESPONSE

Lead the kids through a quiet time of responding to what God is teaching them.



BLESSING

As Large Group ends, speak this blessing over the kids.

May you follow God for all your life, knowing how loved you are and sharing God's love with others!



TRANSITION

After the blessing, the Host should dismiss the kids to return quietly to their classroom (if applicable) and transition to Respond.

WORSHIP RESPONSE



REFLECT: God is Our Leader!

Help kids reflect on the lesson by providing a quiet space for the Holy Spirit to work in their hearts as they think about how it applies to them personally.

Worship Response Station

Supplies: none



SAY:

God is our leader! God loves us so much, and He wants us to share His love with everyone. Jesus wants each of us to be disciples and follow Him. God can use ordinary people like us to share the good news of Jesus when we follow Him!



DO:

- Ask the kids to quietly participate in the following activity. Say:
 - ***When we follow God, He shows us how to love Him, love others and to share the good news of Jesus!***
 - ***Let's practice following God together.***
 - Invite kids to stand up and march around the room as we pretend to follow God.
 - ***As we march around the room, let's say, "God loves me and God loves you!" and point to someone else in line.***
- Close the time by praying over the kids.



BLESSING

As Large Group ends, speak this blessing over the kids.



SAY:

May you follow God for all your life, knowing how loved you are and sharing God's love with others!

RESPOND

The goal of Respond is for kids to think about the lesson and how it applies to them. It should be completed in small groups of 5-7 kids per one Ministry Partner.



APPLY: Why Does it Matter?

Help kids process what they learned in the lesson by answering the Big 3 questions you asked at the beginning of class.



SAY:

Let's answer THE BIG 3 questions for today's lesson & talk about how it applies to our lives!

1. Who was our story about today?

Jesus and his 12 disciples

2. What was the problem?

Jesus called 12 ordinary guys to be his followers, but many didn't think they were good enough to be a disciple

3. What did God do?

Jesus showed the disciples that He is our leader and God can use anyone to do extraordinary things when we have faith in Him

4. Why does this matter to me?

We can all be followers/disciples of Jesus too! Jesus leads us and teaches us how to love God and others through God's Word.

5. How can I apply this to my own life?

Example: I can read the Bible about what Jesus taught His 12 disciples; I can pray and ask God to show me who I can share the good news of Jesus with.



PRAY: Connect Relationally

Help kids understand the power of praying together. Use the Prayer Tags from Check-In to write down prayer requests to take home and pray for during the week.



SAY:

Does anyone have a prayer request they'd like to share? You can also share with a leader privately, if you don't want to share aloud.



DO:

Invite kids to pray for each other, then the leader closes in prayer.

CHECK-OUT

The goal of check-out is to re-connect kids with their parent and communicate any upcoming events or announcements as families leave.



DO:

Encourage kids to finish their activities or play classroom games until their parent comes to pick them up.

As kids get picked up, mention any announcements while handing their parent the announcement card and the weekly **Lesson Card**.
