

Jesus is the Plan

Matthew 2

God Statement: Jesus is the Good News

KEY VERSE:

"She is going to have a son. You must give him the name Jesus. That's because he will save his people from their sins." Matthew 1:21, NIRV

CHECK-IN

Purpose: To build relationships with families and help parents feel comfortable leaving their child.

As parents check-in their child at your classroom, try to welcome them by name to help them feel secure in leaving their child in your care. Once you've completed each of the check-in procedures, welcome the child into your classroom and encourage him/her to play with the classroom toys and activities. If you have LITs in your classroom, this is a great time for them to help engage with the kids while you continue checking in the kids.

If a child is upset or reluctant to enter the room, encourage him or her by offering toys, books or other fun items. If a child is still upset, let the parents know that we will text them if their child continues to be upset. Then, offer to carry the child into the classroom and try to calm the child with toys or other activities.

CONNECT WITH KIDS

Purpose: To build relationships & prioritize safety for our youngest children.

Our goal, first and foremost, when serving babies and young toddlers is to prioritize building trusting relationships and the feeling of safety. We build trust with our littlest kids by meeting needs and helping them learn that church is a secure place where they are loved, known and safe.

The 4 S's are a simple way to keep our hearts and minds focused on this:

When a child feels...(most of the time) SAFE: physically and emotionally SEEN: known and understood SOOTHED: calmed and supported They can become SECURE.

EXPLORE ACTIVITY

(10 minutes)

The Explore Activity is a chance to get the kids thinking about the upcoming Bible story for the day. Encourage your kids to engage with the activity as they prepare for the lesson.

DISCUSS:

In today's lesson, we are going to learn about how Jesus is the Plan. We follow what He tells us to do.

SAY: Have you ever gone on a trip? You usually need a suitcase or a bag or a backpack. Did you know that Jesus went on a trip? We're going to hear more about that in our story today.

PLAY: Suitcase Game

Supplies: suitcase/ backpack/ shopping bag, hat, and mittens

Directions:

- Show the kids the bag and what is inside.
- Show them how to put on the hat and mittens.
- Put the items back in the bag.
- Have the kids sit down in a circle.
- Put the bag in the middle of the circle.
- Let them take turns going to the middle and taking the items out of the bag and putting them on.

SAY: I wonder what kind of bag Jesus' mom and dad took on their trip. What kind of things do you think they took on their trip?

WORSHIP TIME

Purpose: Engage our youngest children through the power of music!

Use the Little Kids music videos on Plex to sing some simple songs with your class. To access these videos, go to **Plex > Videos > EC > Babies folder**.

READ THE BIBLE STORY

Purpose: Engage our youngest children in a meaningful way by teaching God's word!

This week, read about a Bible story from Matthew 2.

Read the Bible story below. Try to engage the child(ren) as you share the story by showing pictures and repeating key words and phrases. It's ok if you don't read every word of the story! Kids have very short attention spans (1 minute for each year of age) so try to keep your interactions short and don't get discouraged if a child loses focus!

THIS WEEK'S LESSON: Flight to Egypt

(Summarized from Bible passage Matthew 2)

BIBLE STORY:

Bring Hamilton (the hedgehog puppet) out and allow the kids to interact with him before you begin the story (they can feel his soft fur, give him high fives, give him a hug, etc.). Use Hamilton to help keep the kids engaged while you share the story (he can do the hand motions, ask the kids questions, etc.).

Invite Hamilton to come out and see the class. Hamilton is holding a small suitcase or box.

SAY: Hi Hamilton, what do you have there? *Hamilton shows us.* Why do you have a suitcase? Are you going somewhere? *Hamilton whispers to you.* Oh, you're visiting your Grandma? Baby Jesus had to go on a trip when he was just a little guy. Let's listen to this true Bible story. *Hamilton nods.*

Share the story of Mary, Joseph, and Jesus moving to Egypt while using the story cards in your folder.

SAY:

- Have you ever moved to a new house?
- What was that like?
- Were you a little nervous to move? Sometimes we look like this when we are nervous or afraid.
 - *Make a nervous face.* Now encourage the kids to make a nervous face.
- After Baby Jesus was born, there were some people who didn't like Him.
- One of them was King Herod. He wanted to hurt him.
- An angel came to Jesus' dad, Joseph, and told him it was time to move to keep Jesus safe.
- They packed their bags and left for Egypt.
 - Let's pretend to pack our bags. What do you want to take with you? Let the kids answer. Pretend to take that item that a kid mentions and pretend to put it in a suitcase.
- Do you know that many years before Jesus was even born, the Bible said that Jesus would come out of Egypt? The Bible is always right!
- King Herod tried to hurt Jesus, but he couldn't.
- God protected Jesus.
- Jesus is the plan to save the world. Jesus is the plan!

BLESSING (1 minute)

Read the verse and blessing over the kids before closing Large Group. Encourage the kids to stand and open their hands to receive the blessing as a truth that they can take with them this week and hide in their hearts.

SAY: Friends, may you always remember that when hard things happen in your life, Jesus is the plan and He is with you.

PLAY!

Purpose: Engage our youngest children by playing games and having fun!

While your class can participate in free play for most of the remaining classroom time, please try to lead at least one structured activity. This is a great opportunity to introduce kids to classroom games and encourage interaction and participation with others.

Suggestions of activities for Babies & Younger 1 Year Old's:

- Play Peek-A-Boo
- Read a board book
- Build a tower and let kids knock it down
- Play with a ball
- Roll a large car back and forth
- Take turns putting toys in a bin or bucket

Suggestions of activities for Older 1 Year Old's:

- Hide an object and let kids find it
- Name and count parts of the body
- Discuss colors & numbers
- Turn on music and play freeze dance
- Have kids follow simple instructions (hop, sit down, clap, etc.)

CHECK-OUT

(end of service)

As parents arrive for check-out, the kids can continue participating in free play. Follow the check-out procedures for your classroom, making sure to send all of the child's belongings (diaper bag, bottle/sippy cup, pacifier, blanket, etc.) with the parent. Give the parent encouragement about how the child did in your class and say "Bye (child's name)! "
